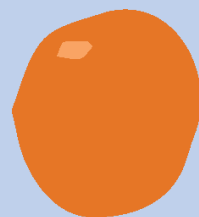

Conference Clinicians

Dr. Andre J. Thomas – Adult Clinician

ANDRÉ J. THOMAS is an associated artist with the London Symphony Orchestra. Thomas is Professor Emeritus of Music at Florida State University. He was visiting Professor of Choral Conducting at Yale University from 2020-2022. He previously served as a faculty member at the University of Texas, Austin. Dr. Thomas received his degrees from Friends University (B.A.), Northwestern University (M. M.), and The University of Illinois (D.M.A). He is in demand as a choral adjudicator, clinician, and director of Honor/All-State Choirs throughout North America, Europe, Asia, New Zealand, Australia, and Africa. Dr. Thomas has conducted choirs at the state, division, and national conventions of the Music Educators National Conference (NAfME) and the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). His international conducting credits are extensive. They include conductor/clinician for the International Federation of Choral Musicians' summer residency of the World Youth Choir in the the Republic of China and the Philippines. He was also the conductor of the World Youth Choir's winter residency in Europe and a premier performance by an American choir (Florida State University Singers) in Vietnam. He has been the guest conductor of such distinguished orchestras and choirs as the Birmingham Symphony Orchestra in England, guest Conductor for the Berlin Radio Choir and the North German Radio Choir in Germany, the Netherlands Radio Choir, The Bulgarian Radio Choir and Orchestra, the Charlotte Symphony, Tallahassee Symphony, China's People's Liberation Orchestra and the Czech National Symphony Orchestra and London Symphony. For the thirty-first season, he served as Artistic Director of the Tallahassee Community Chorus. Thomas has also distinguished himself as a composer/arranger. Hinshaw Music Company, Mark Foster Music Company, Fitzsimons Music Company, Lawson Gould, Earthsongs, Choristers Guild, and Heritage Music Company publishes his compositions and arrangements. Dr. Thomas has produced two instructional videos, "What They See Is What You Get" on choral conducting, with Rodney Eichenberger, and "Body, Mind, Spirit, Voice" on adolescent voices, with Anton Armstrong. His recent book "Way Over in Beulah Lan'. Understanding and Performing the Negro Spiritual" has quickly become a significant source in this area of study. Various musical organizations have recognized Thomas. The African Diaspora Sacred Music honored Dr. Thomas as a Living Legend. In 2011, Thomas' dedication to and accomplishments in the choral arts was recognized by his peers in Chorus America when the organization presented Dr. Thomas with its Distinguished Service Award. In March 2017, ACDA presented Thomas with its highest honor the Robert Shaw Award, and in November of 2017, NCCO (National Collegiate Choral Organization presented Thomas with its Lifetime Achievement Award. In January 2019, he was inducted into the Florida Music Educator's Hall of Fame. In 2022 he was presented with the Award of Excellence from the Southern Region of ACDA. Yale University School of Music presented Thomas with the Samuel Simons Sanford Medal. It is the most prestigious honor conferred by the Yale School of Music. He is a past president of the Florida ACDA and the past president of the Southern Division of ACDA and the current President of National ACDA.

Mark Stover – Youth Choir Clinician

Mark Stover shares his passion for people and building community through pursuing the highest levels of artistry in choral music. Since September 2018, he has served as associate director of choirs at the University of Michigan where he conducts the Men's Glee Club and the University Choir, teaches conducting, and serves as conductor of the Michigan Youth Chamber Singers. Stover came to Ann Arbor from Northfield, Minnesota, home of Saint Olaf College, where he served on the music faculty as conductor of the St. Olaf Chapel Choir (SATB) and Viking Chorus (TTBB). Both of these choirs have regularly appeared in the annual St. Olaf Christmas Festival, a tradition held for over a century and regarded around the world as one of the great music festivals of the season. Stover led the Chapel Choir, Viking Chorus, and the Festival Mass Choir of over 400 voices in the St. Olaf Christmas Festival presented at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis at the 2017 National Convention of the American Choral Conductors Association (ACDA). Mark Stover holds degrees from St. Olaf College and Luther Seminary where he studied conducting and choral repertoire under the mentorship of Dr. Anton Armstrong and Dr. Paul Westermeyer. In addition to his professorial role at the University of Michigan, he is also pursuing the Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting at Michigan State University, studying with Dr. David Rayl, Dr. Sandra Snow and Dr. Jonathan Reed.

Judy Britts – Middle School Clinician

Judy Britts is a music teacher, vocal coach, educator, encourager, and conductor, simply translated to, "I teach children to sing". As founder of the Northern California Children's Chorus, her goal in creating the chorus was to give children and youth an excellent choral experience in the areas surrounding Sacramento, California. As a music performance major at San Jose State University, she studied conducting with Dr. Charlene Archibeque and presented her senior recital in choral conducting with a choir of 60 girls she had worked with the previous summer. Mrs. Britts received her master's degree in education from CSU, Sacramento. During her career, Mrs. Britts has led choirs in very large churches with over 150 in her children's choirs and very small churches with only 6 in a choir, and everything in-between. Her church positions have included conducting children, youth, and adults. She taught at private Christian schools in Santa Rosa and Sacramento and is currently the Founder and Artistic Director of the Northern California Children's Chorus. Mrs. Britts also enjoys the opportunities she is given to conduct the church choir she sings with on occasion. A nationally sought-after festival director and music workshop clinician, Ms. Britts has provided workshops for organizations including the American Choral Directors Association, American Guild of Organists, Choral Conductors Guild and Choristers Guild. A real joy is leading choirs at various summer camps like Mt Hermon Christian Conference Center and Lake Junaluska. As an advocate for children participating and leading in worship, she has served two terms on the Board of Directors for Choristers Guild.

Teresa Granger – Junior Choir Clinician

Teresa Granger, a native of North Carolina, holds the Bachelor of Music Degree in Choral Music Education from Furman University, a Master's Degree in Music Education from the University of Georgia, and holds certifications in Kindermusik and Orff. Teresa is currently teaching preschool music at the First Presbyterian Weekday School three days a week. She is the former music teacher at Rocky Branch Elementary School in Watkinsville, GA where she taught students in grades K-5. Her teaching career spans over 35 years of elementary music teaching in Georgia, South Carolina, Kentucky, and North Carolina. During her career, Teresa has taught and written curriculum for preschool, regular education, and special needs learners. Teresa has also worked collaboratively with the UGA Hugh Hodgson School of Music as a supervising teacher for practicum students and student teachers. Teresa serves as the Children's Choir Coordinator at First Baptist Church, Athens, GA, and director of the Joyful Singers Choir for children in grades 3-6. She has coordinated and served with summer music camps for children including the Summer Fine Arts Camp, First Baptist Church, Athens, GA and the Music and Arts Week at First United Methodist Church, Athens, GA. Teresa has served as a Children's Choirs clinician representing *Growing in Grace* for the *Children's Choir Summit* in 2017 and the *Alleluia Conference* at Baylor University in 2016 and 2019. She was a guest children's choir clinician for the Shocco Springs Children's Choir Summit for the Alabama Baptist Convention in 2015, the *Celebrating Grace Church Music Leadership conference* and *Church Music Georgia*, in 2013. Additionally, Teresa was a curriculum writer for the Spring 2014 and Fall 2019 *Growing in Grace* Children's Choir Curriculum. Teresa resides in Athens, Ga with her husband, Frank Granger. They have two adult sons, Ben and Adam.

Terry Taylor – Cherub and Primary Choir Clinician

Terry Taylor is Managing Editor of *Growing in Grace* Children's Music Curriculum, a comprehensive faith-based resource in use in over 1000 churches and schools in 40 states. From 1980-2012 Terry served as a full-time Minister of Music. He received a BCM from Belmont University and a MCM from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Terry is widely respected for his creativity, advocacy, and leadership in music ministry with children. He is the founder and director of the Children's Freedom Choir, which reaches out to socially and economically challenged children in south Nashville. Terry is married to Tammie Taylor, a music educator/band director. They have three young-adult children, Carrie Beth, Jeremy, and Rebecca and three pretty-much-perfect grandchildren, Cayden, IsaBeall, and Hudson.

Andy Jacob – Conference Organist

Andrew Jacob holds an active career as an organist and church musician. He currently serves as the Organist and Co-Director of Music at Augustana Lutheran Church in West St. Paul, MN, a congregation with a long history of excellence in the arts. His greatest joy at the organ comes when leading a worshiping congregation in song. He has led hymn festivals around the country in academic institutions and churches of various denominations and has been invited to coach hymn playing and improvisation techniques at continuing education conferences for organists and church musicians. In addition to his role at Augustana, Andy is the Music Director for St. Olaf College's (Northfield, MN) internationally syndicated sacred music radio program, *Sing for Joy*.

Each week, the program airs sacred choral music following the scriptural lessons specified in the Revised Common Lectionary. A multiple prize recipient, he is the winner of the 2019 Ruth and Paul Manz Scholarship Competition administered by the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, the 2020 American Guild of Organists' Student Commissioning Project Grant, and the 2021 Richard VanScriber Church Music Scholarship in Organ through Metropolitan Music Ministries in Charlotte, NC. Andy earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in music from St. Olaf College and a Master of Music degree in organ performance from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA) where he was a Kenan Organ Scholar. His primary teachers have included Dr. Catherine Rodland and James Bobb at St. Olaf and Dr. Timothy Olsen at UNCSA.

General Information

Medical Issues: Should an accident or injury occur that requires a hospital visit, a chaperone or church member from your group is responsible for taking the person to the hospital or urgent care. It is the church's responsibility to obtain medical forms, release forms and any other items pertaining to medical issues or medication during the time of the conference. Be sure to let the Bonclarken Office know.

Chaperones: One non-singing adult chaperone must accompany every ten participants and must accompany young children swimming. All participants (even one or two) are required to have an adult chaperone on the Bonclarken grounds. Chaperones are responsible for checking on all participants at all rehearsals and activities and enforcing Quiet Time.

Children's Church: This activity is for Junior, Primary, and Cherub choir members in the Rec Building. Children's Church will take place each morning during Morning Worship. Cherubs and Primaries will be escorted to crafts, recreation, or rehearsal by Music Conference counselors to the Rec Building, where they will be served a snack before Children's Church. Cherubs should be picked up PROMPTLY AT 10:40 AM in the old gym. Primary Choir members will be escorted to their next rehearsal by the counselors. Junior Choir members will join Children's Church at 10:20 AM after their rehearsal and will be escorted to their next activity by the counselors.

Nibble Nook Devotions: Nibble Nook Devotions are held nightly at 9:45 PM for Middle School and Youth Choir members, chaperones, and adults.

Ice Cream, Snacks and soft drinks: These are available for purchase at the Nibble Nook. Hours are: Monday - Thursday from 1:00 - 5:00 PM, 7:45 - 11:00 PM. Friday hours are 1:00 - 5:00, 9:00 - midnight.

A **non-refundable CONFERENCE fee of \$50 per participant** must accompany registration. All deposits must be paid online with a Credit Card or by Electronic Check. (Instructions will be online). **Balance is to be paid online by CHECK ONLY or upon arrival Sunday afternoon** at the conference registration. List all participants and the choir and voice part each is assigned to in the online registration form. (Use the form in this booklet as a worksheet before logging into the online registration system with Bonclarken.)

If you have any ADDITIONAL Conferees to register after May 15, 2023, please call the Bonclarken Office - 828.692.2223 and they will assist you with adding conferees or making changes. THERE IS NO LATE REGISTRATION FEE THIS YEAR, but please know that you can register any additional people until the time of the conference.

THE MAY 15, 2023 deadline is so that we can order the appropriate amount of music to have on hand. ANYONE that registers very late will not be guaranteed a packet of music, So PLEASE try to register by May 15, 2023.

T-shirts may be purchased for **\$20** for all sizes except Adult XXL, which is **\$23**. Include T-shirt money when these are ordered online, prior to the conference.

Primary and Junior Choir members are divided into **Group “A” and Group “B” for Crafts and Recreation** during Music Conference. **The contact person from your church or group should sign up your group for either Group “A” or Group “B” during the Online Registration process.** Please have a list of your Primary and Junior Choir members with you to add to the correct group when you are registering online.

On-Site Registration hours on Sunday are 3:00 PM until 6:45 PM. Opening Worship service is at 7:00 PM Sunday evening.

Music Conference Office is in the **HOTEL MUSIC ROOM**.
